

## BELSIZE BAROQUE ORCHESTRA LEADER SCHOLARSHIP

### Summary

Belsize Baroque is a London based period instrument ensemble made up of students, professionals, and amateur players. We perform around four concerts a year with a variety of leading professional directors from the Early Music community. Concerts and rehearsals are managed by a dedicated group of volunteers. Rehearsals are normally held within one week of each concert.

One of the objectives of Belsize Baroque is to support musicians at the start of their careers. The purpose of the Belsize Baroque Scholarship is to provide an exceptional musician with financial support and an opportunity to gain experience in leading a period instrument orchestra.

At the moment we are expecting to run socially distanced concerts where possible. Due to the uncertainty, proposed concert dates including scholarship concerts may be cancelled or moved to a later date.

### Scholarship

- The Belsize Scholar will be required to lead in **four** concerts (where we are able to schedule them) during the period commencing September 2021. Where the director is a violinist this may be leading a section rather than the whole orchestra.
- The amount of the scholarship is £800 and will be paid in instalments
- The successful candidate will be chosen via application, interview and audition

### Eligibility

Each candidate must

- be a student at an internationally recognised conservatoire or music college who is undertaking postgraduate study as at 1<sup>st</sup> October 2021; or
- have completed a postgraduate degree at a conservatoire or music college in the 3 years prior to 1<sup>st</sup> October 2021

In addition, candidates should be able to

- demonstrate the requisite technical competence on baroque violin; and
- demonstrate the leadership, organisational, and interpersonal skills required to lead and develop the string section of Belsize Baroque

## **Key Responsibilities**

The Belsize Baroque Scholar will be an integral and key part of the orchestra. Therefore, as leader, s/he will be required to

- actively take on the role of leader of Belsize Baroque, and act as violin soloist as the repertoire demands;
- be familiar with the parts, including solos, preparing them in advance;
- participate in all rehearsals (3 before each concert) and the performances of four Belsize Baroque concerts;
- ensure that string parts are marked with bowing prior to the first rehearsal of each concert referred to above;
- collaborate with the director of each concert to ensure rehearsal time is smooth and effective for all players;
- be an effective communicator bearing in mind the mix of players, contributing to an encouraging lively atmosphere; and
- collaborate with the orchestra administrator and volunteers.

## **Application Instructions**

### Stage One

Candidates should submit a cover letter and CV, along with a reference. Please send your application to [veronese68@hotmail.co.uk](mailto:veronese68@hotmail.co.uk), no later than Friday 18<sup>th</sup> June 2021. All applications will be acknowledged. Candidates selected for audition will be notified by 28<sup>th</sup> June.

### Stage Two

Selected candidates will be requested to attend an interview and audition, currently scheduled to take place in the evening of 5<sup>th</sup> July in London. The audition will involve a short interview and performance of a solo on baroque violin (candidate's choice).

Final results will be notified to candidates by no later than 16<sup>th</sup> July 2021

## **Important Information**

Belsize Baroque Orchestra is already engaged to perform on the following dates. Please bear this in mind before you make your application. The successful candidate will be required to participate in these. However, due to the current uncertainty these dates may be subject to change.

September 12 – rehearsals September 6 (evening), September 11 (daytime), September 12 (afternoon)

November 28 – rehearsals November 22 (evening), November 27 (daytime), November 28 (afternoon)

January 23 2022 – rehearsals January 17 (evening), January 22 (daytime), January 23 (afternoon)
